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Program Overview

- In the SY23 budget, the Murphy Oliver Administration made an unprecedented commitment of \$180 million to address the ongoing threat of childhood lead poisoning.
- To date, the Lead Remediation and Abatement Program has funded
 - 26 Grantees
 - 18 Coming on Board
 - 2 Undergoing Training



Lead Training Initiative

Paid training for interested entities to become LRAP Grantees

18 agencies have successfully completed training (ranging from non-profits to municipalities)

2 agencies are currently undergoing training

Program Improvements

- Creation of Lead Training Institute to prepare future grantees and increase pool of contractors
- Creation of Online Portal for LRAP Application submission
- Policy changes to separate Program Support Costs
- Expansion of Eligibility
 - Reduction in Documentation Requirements
 - Categorical Eligibility
 - Section 8
 - ► LIHEAP/USF
 - ► LIWAP
 - Weatherization
- Cash Advance Policy
- Hired a 3rd party organization to do statewide marketing

- Audio ads in English and Spanish
- Targeted Google Ads for landlords and tenants
- Revamped General Information Flyer
- Community Outreach Events
- ► Newest Efforts:
 - Utilization of Lead Inspection Law Reporting Data to refer lead positive cases to grantees
 - Collaborating with NJAAP on Project ECHO to have more streamlined referrals to grantees.
